

2005 Year in Review



Each year DSANI continues to grow and our 6th year was no exception. Our membership base remains at about 150 families, friends and professionals. From our humble beginning with a single Buddy Walk to our ability to have a strengthen and presence in the Down syndrome community within northeast Indiana as well as state-wide. Some of the highlights of the year include:

- Provided new parent packets to hospitals and physicians in northeast Indiana
- Published the DSANI Star newsletter on a monthly basis
- Launched a new DSANI website
- Continued to add materials to the extensive DSANI library of books and other materials on Down syndrome
- Sponsored several social programs including annual holiday party, swimming, bowling, Mom's Night Out, Wizards game and much more

Programs
